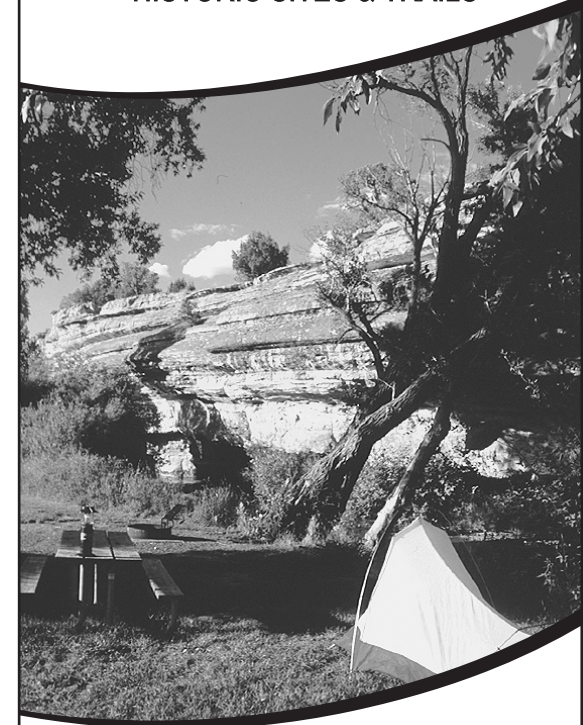

# Reservations

- Reservations can be made by calling the reservation center at 877-996-7275 or going online to [www.wyo-park.com](http://www.wyo-park.com). Reservations can also be cancelled online, but other changes must be made through the reservation center.

- Reservations can be made for arrival dates May 15 through September 15 by calling 877-996-7275 or going online to [www.wyo-park.com](http://www.wyo-park.com).

- Several sites may be reserved with a single call, but payment of reservation fees for all sites is required before confirmation is made.

- Reservations may be made at the following locations: Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, Guernsey and Keyhole State Parks and Medicine Lodge State Archaeological Site.

## When to call

- Campsite reservations are accepted up to 90 days prior to your arrival at the above listed locations. Campsites may be reserved for arrival dates between May 15 and September 15.

- The reservation center is open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (MST) Monday through Saturday year-round, except Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Online reservations can be made 24 hours a day, but sites cannot be reserved ahead of the time they become available at the reservation center. First date to make reservations is February 15 to arrive on May 15.

- Reservations are accepted as few as two days prior to arrival when using a credit card, or 10 days for other payment methods.

*Example: Wednesday is the last day to reserve a site for the upcoming Friday. Thursday is the last day to reserve for Saturday.*

## Important dates

*Reservations are accepted up to 90 days before the date you are to arrive.*

## Fees

- Reservation fees must be paid when reservations are made. Credit card, money order or personal checks are accepted. Only one payment is accepted for multiple-site reservations. Non-credit card payments must be received within five days after making a reservation.

- All sites in the reservation system will be reservation only ... no first come, first serve. These sites are in the reservation system May 15 through September 15.

- Upon arriving at the site, visitors with reservations must check in at designated check-in areas. Check-in/out times are 10:00 a.m.

- **A no-show will be determined if the visitor has not arrived 24 hours after the reservation 10 a.m. check-in time. The site will return to reservable status.**

- If you plan to leave your site unoccupied for more than 24 hours, please notify staff at the designated check-in area.

- There is an \$9 per site non-refundable reservation fee.

- A \$5 cancellation fee will be charged for each campsite reserved if you cancel or modify an existing reservation.

- If you plan on camping in one of the sites managed by the Wyoming State Parks & Historic Sites, you must pay both a daily use fee and a camping fee. These fees are payable at the location you visit. One hundred percent of your fees goes directly back to the parks and sites for improvements.

- Annual permits may also be purchased online through the reservation center, or at our official selling agent locations throughout the state. Please visit the web site for an updated list.

Daily use permits required at Buffalo Bill, Boysen, Curt Gowdy, Edness K. Wilkins, Glendo, Guernsey, Keyhole and Seminoe State Parks; Ft. Bridger, South Pass City, Trail End, Ft. Fetterman and Ft. Phil Kearny State Historic Sites; and Hawk Springs Recreation Area. No fee for persons 17 years and under at Historic Sites.

No daily use charged at Connor Battlefield Historic Site, Medicine Lodge Archaeological Site and Sinks Canyon State Park.

Overnight camping permits required at Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, Guernsey, Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon State Parks; Connor Battlefield Historic Site; Medicine Lodge Archaeological Site; and Hawk Springs Recreation Area.
